FRIENDSHIP FAMILY HOME TREASURER'S SUMMARY

Happy Holidays from the Friendship Family Home Board of Directors. We sincerely hope that this newsletter finds you and your family healthy and happy this holiday season. Our purpose at the Friendship Family Home remains unchanged: to provide a home-like atmosphere and care for 6 adult women with developmental disabilities. Additionally, it is our desire to provide a home environment that allows the women to become as self-sufficient as possible and to grow socially and emotionally all while being cared for in a dignified and humane manner.

FFH remains guided by an all-volunteer Board of Directors made up of individuals and husband/wife teams who are genuinely and wholeheartedly committed to the mission of this Christian-based home. The organization is a Private 501(C)3 Nonprofit Corporation as defined by the Internal Revenue Service and, as such, is eligible to receive tax-deductible donations.

Our staff has been evolving over the last year and now consists of 8 personnel who work remarkably well together to provide the required protection and supervision of residents twenty-four (24) hours a day, seven (7) days a week. They are highly experienced and extensively trained in a variety of skills including CPR, first aid, how to handle social interaction between the residents, and all the requirements of Community Mental Health (CMH). Assistance with personal care and grooming is provided as specified in the resident care agreement and assessment plans. Laundry service along with home cooked meals served family-style are provided.

Through the never-ending Grace of God, along with the overwhelming generosity of the community, the FFH financial status is very sound. Over the years, through your kindness, the FFH physical home has been more than adequately maintained—with updates/improvements being addressed as needed. This year, the Board undertook the removal and replacement of the home's deck and wraparound walkway as these wooden items were built with the original home and overdue for replacement.

FFH receives approximately 70%-75% of its annual funding from the State of Michigan and Social Security; the remainder is provided by your gracious, individual gift giving and support from local churches. Your donations and prayers are a key aspect to maintain the functioning of the FFH; your tax-deductible donations are accepted by check or cash using the pre-addressed, post-paid envelope included with this letter. You can also contribute to the FFH Endowment Fund held by the Cadillac Area Community Foundation by directing your donation to the Endowment Fund.
